Anthropomorphism

the representation of objects (especially a god) as having human form or traits

Autobiography

A biography of yourself

Biography

an account of the series of events making up a person's life

Character

a property that defines the apparent individual nature of something

Conflict

an open clash between two opposing groups (or individuals)

Dialogue

a conversation between two persons

Documentary

a film or TV program presenting the facts about a person or event

Fantasy

imagination unrestricted by reality

Foreshadowing

the act of providing vague advance indications; representing beforehand

Parody

composition that imitates somebody's style, usually in a humorous way

Point of View position from which things are viewed

Setting

the physical position or location of something

Theme

the subject matter or idea of a conversation, artwork, or composition

Tragedy

an event resulting in great loss and misfortune
