SPACE: CHOOSE YOUR OWN ADVENTURE

You learned about and practiced 1 point perspective, 2 point perspective, showing space in a landscape, and using negative space. It's time to choose how you will use space in a work of art!

CHOOSE YOUR OWN ADVENTURE

1. 1 Point Perspective

a. Name

i. Draw your name in block letters and use 1 point perspective to make them 3D. Color or shade them to create highlights and shadows which will make them look EVEN MORE 3D.

b. Landscape

Draw a landscape or cityscape using 1 point perspective. Add lots of details!

c. Shapes

Draw lots of shapes around your paper then use 1 point perspective to make them "zoom" into the vanishing point in the center.



- a. Draw multiple boxes above, below, and crossing the horizon line. Shade the boxes with one side dark, one medium, and one light, keeping your light source consistent.
- b. Use 2 point perspective to design a city block with multiple buildings.
- c. Draw something "built" out of boxes using 2 point perspective.

3. Landscape

a. Use layers and overlapping to create a landscape with a sense of space allowing you to see into the distance. Remember things that are further away are smaller and higher up on the picture plane.

4. Negative Space Design

a. Draw the shape of something (or multiple somethings that belong together) and fill the negative space with designs instead of the positive space.

5. Check your idea with Mrs.Morris

a. Have a different idea on how to utilize space in a drawing? Talk to Mrs.Morris to get your idea approved!
