| Prompt \# | Assignment Guidelines: <br> 1Write out the first 10 things that come to mind when you hear the word Red. Draw <br> and/or collage everything that you listed. Use color. |
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| 2 | If you were stranded on an uninhabited island what would you bring? List and <br> illustrate/collage your Top 10 Essential Items and explain why they are necessary. <br> Use color. |
| 3 | Trace your hand and forearm. Inside of your tracing use colors and abstract forms <br> to suggest a season. Outside of your tracing use line and representational forms <br> to suggest the 'opposite' season. |
| 4 | Create a full page of doodles using pen or marker. Blank areas larger than a nickle <br> are not allowed. |
| 5 | What scares you? Illustrate a phobia (it doesn't have to be yours necessarily) and <br> use color. |


| 6 | Draw/Collage 5 objects you can't live without and label them. Use color. None of <br> your drawings can be smaller than a dollar bill - it's okay to go off of the page! |
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| 7 | Write and acrostic poem with your first name. Illustrate your poem using drawing <br> and/or collage. Use color. |
| 8 | Create a Surrealist collage of a landscape scene. Your composition should have <br> a clear foreground, middle ground, and background. All found images must be <br> meaningful and none of the the source paper may be visible. |
| 9 | Illustrate the weather today using just line and color. No filled in areas are <br> allowed! |
| 10 | Describe your walk/ride/drive to school this morning. Was it cold out? Were you <br> running late? What did the sky look like? Were you listening to music? What was it? <br> Who were you with? <br> Illustrate your experience using drawing or collage. Fill the page! |
| 11 | Write out or paste in the lyrics to your favorite song. Illustrate it. Verses don't need <br> to be repeated. It's okay to just write/paste the section being illustrated. Keep it <br> appropriate. |


| 12 | Illustrate a wacky invention. Show different angles and label the various <br> components. What does your invention do? |
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| 13 | Draw a cartoon of yourself and your environment. Cartoon 1-2 of your <br> friends/family/pets also. Use color. Dead space and stick figures are banned! |
| 14 | Create a drawing of an original shoe/boot/sneaker that you have designed. Use <br> mixed media (more than one medium). This should only bear a passing <br> resemblance to existing footwear designs! |
| 15 | If you could go anywhere on vacation, where would you go? Illustrate or collage <br> your destination. Use color. A collage by definition features more than one found <br> image. No Dead Space! |
| 16 | Draw your first name, last name, or initials using graffiti styled bubble/block <br> letters. Use at least 3 colors and colored pencils or markers. Fill the page! |
| 17 | Create a drawing of a tool (flashlight, hammer, pliers, etc) from observation; make <br> your drawing at least 5x5". Put the tool in an unusual setting and out of scale (too <br> big or too small). For example: A flashlight being used as a spotlight by a rockband <br> of insects. Use colored pencil. |
| 18 | Draw a cartoon of an anthropomorphic food - Use colored pencil. Fill the page <br> and add a caption to your creation. |
| 19 | Create an ambigram (a word that is another word when viewed upside down). Try <br> to use a pallindrome (a word or phrase that is the same backwards as forward). <br> Look online for examples but do not copy them! Use block letters. Fill the page. |
| 20 | If you could be a superhero/villain, what would your superpower be? Create a <br> sketch or collage a super-you and describe your powers and your reason for being <br> in a sentence or two. Use color. |
