GESTURE DRAWING; FIGURE STUDY

Project Information: Students will explore gesture drawing through creating figure studies.

Project Instructions:

- View the following YouTube video for initial instructions and idea development:
 - <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xbE0vYgng00>
- Next, on whatever paper you have available, practice drawing a figure using a family member as your model and a pencil.
 - Create a gesture drawing that with a 3-minute time length.
 - Create a gesture drawing with a 5-minute time length.
 - Create a gesture drawing with an 8-minute time length.
 - Create a gesture drawing with a 10-minute time length.
 - Create a gesture drawing with a 15-minute time length.
- After you have practiced drawing a figure for each of the time lengths above, have your model switch poses and create a series of three figure studies that are each 15 minutes in time length on a single sheet of paper.
- If you enjoyed this project, repeat the instructions above and create another figure study using a different model and set of poses.



DRAWING STUDY; HUMAN HAIR

Project Information: Students will explore how to draw realistic hair on both a male and female.

Project Instructions:

- Follow the step-by-step instructions on how to draw hair that has volume and value on both males and females using a pencil
- Once you have practiced drawing hair multiple times, use a reference image of your own and create a single study of model's hair.

DRAWING STUDY; HUMAN HANDS

Project Information: Students will explore how to draw realistic hands with shading.

- Once you have practiced drawing at least one hand with pencil, create a series of three hand studies on a single sheet of paper that has each hand positioned in a different pose.
- If you enjoyed this project, repeat the instructions above and create another hand study using different media – such as crayon, marker, ink pen, or sharpie.
