## Video Planning Reflection Questions

**Connecting** - Identifying relationships and connections of cause and effect, actively constructing an understanding of motivation and tension in relationships.

- · Who/what is your protagonist?
- · What/who is your antagonist?
- · What choices do the characters make that set up the tension in the plot?
- · What choices do the characters make to create equilibrium?

**Questioning/Critical Thinking** – Planning and thinking through topics/stories, and communicating those things to an audience (VOICE\* and TONE):

- · Who is my audience? Explain.
- · What/how do I want them to think about the topic/story? Explain.
- · How can I communicate my ideas effectively? Explain.
